The Finnish Community in China starts construction of a primary school in Sichuan

A Finnish charity project has reached an important milestone. The construction of a primary School in Sichuan has been started according to schedule. Completion is expected in September. The project held the traditional Chinese ground breaking ceremony with the local education bureau in Guanghan city, Sichuan on May 5th.

After 512, the Wenchuan Earthquake, individuals, corporations, and governments donated millions in emergency relief. However the structural damages could be measured in billions - if not trillions. A charity project was spontaneously formed by Finnish and Chinese individuals, working with Finnish companies in China. The Finnish Community wanted to contribute to creating lasting infrastructure in the society that has so kindly accepted them as their guests. Building a school matches very well the Finnish mentality and values which holds education in very high regard. The project has been named "FenFang project".

The objective of the project is to build a primary school in Guiyuan village of Guanghan Town in Deyang District of Sichuan Province. The school, to be named Fenfang Spring Bud School, will be a primary school, grades 1 through 6 with a capacity for 250 students. The project budget is about RMB 4.2m. The project is supported by China Children's and Teenagers Fund (CCTF) and the local government.

The management of the Finnish Charity School Project is now happy to announce that, despite the dismal economic climate, it has succeeded in securing enough funds to commence with the first phase of the construction project: starting construction of the main building. However, the over-all budget for the school campus is only 90% complete. A few more donors are still needed and thus encouraged to join this rapidly growing crowd.

To commemorate this milestone the project will have a ground breaking ceremony of the school on site in GuiYuan village in Sichuan. The construction work is expected to be finished by the beginning of the next school year in September.
